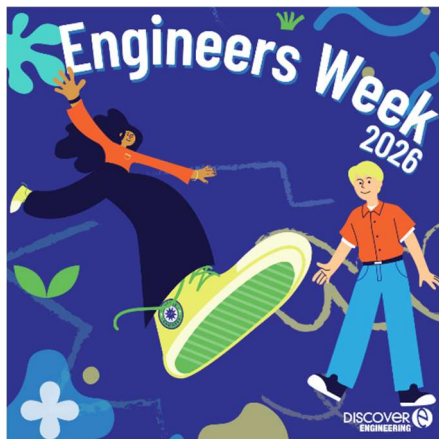

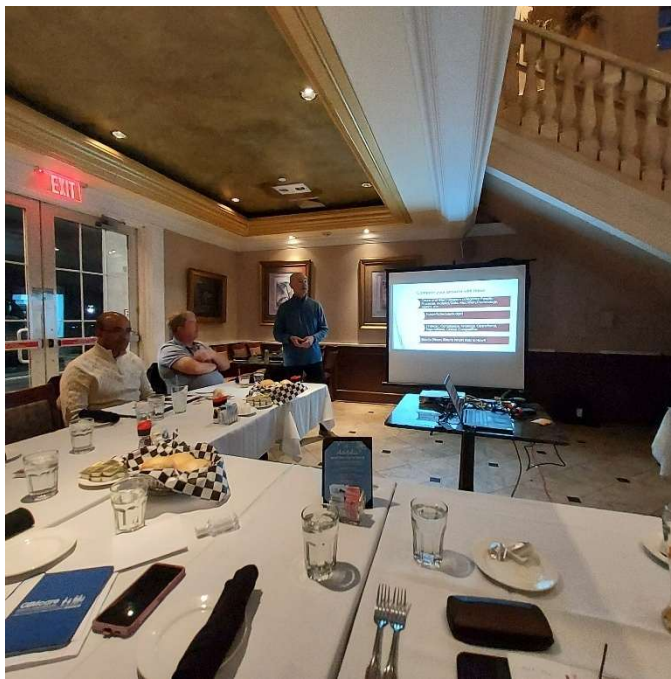

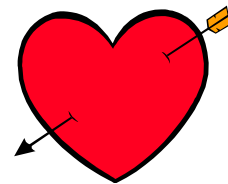
### **January Meeting Was A Big Hit!**

After school clubs were formed as students spent many hours on their projects brainstorming/conceiving, computer simulating, essay writing, physical model building, and practicing their presentations. I don't know if the learned skills, dedication and motivation to accomplish their projects came easily; but they did come; ensuring each student benefited from their efforts.

These students deserve the support of their parents, mentors, Future City organization, and the 26 professional societies and individual companies – including the IIE – South Jersey Delaware Valley Chapter. Our chapter sponsored the **P. Robert Siebeneicher, II - Industrial Engineering Award** which was won by **Howard Gardner Multiple Intelligence Charter School from Scranton Pa**.
